

ACCUSATION

18 Complainant alleges:

19 **PARTIES**

20 1. Susan Saylor (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity as the
21 Registrar/Executive Officer of the Structural Pest Control Board (Board), Department of
22 Consumer Affairs.

23 2. On or about March 10, 2003, the Board issued Field Representative License Number
24 FR 35645 to Darrell Allen Miner (Respondent). The Field Representative License was in full force
25 and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on June 30, 2017,
26 unless renewed.

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1 **JURISDICTION**

2 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following
3 laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise
4 indicated.

5 4. Section 8620 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may suspend or
6 revoke a license when it finds that the holder, while a licensee or applicant, has committed any acts
7 or omissions constituting cause for disciplinary action or in lieu of a suspension may assess a civil
8 penalty.

9 5. Section 8625 of the Code states:

10 The lapsing or suspension of a license or company registration by operation of
11 law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender
12 of a license or company registration shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to
13 proceed with any investigation of or action or disciplinary proceeding against such
14 licensee or company, or to render a decision suspending or revoking such license or
15 registration.

14 **STATUTORY PROVISIONS**

15 6. Section 498 of the Code states:

16 A board may revoke, suspend, or otherwise restrict a license on the ground that the
17 licensee secured the license by fraud, deceit, or knowing misrepresentation of a material
18 fact or by knowingly omitting to state a material fact.

18 7. Section 8637 of the Code states: "Misrepresentation of a material fact by the
19 applicant in obtaining a license or company registration is a ground for disciplinary action."

20 8. Section 8641 of the Code provides that failure to comply with the provisions of the
21 Business and Professions Code, or any rule or regulation adopted by the Board, is a ground for
22 disciplinary action.

23 9. Section 8593 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board shall require as a
24 condition to the renewal of each operator's and field representative's license that the holder submit
25 proof satisfactory to the board that he or she has informed himself or herself of developments in
26 the field of pest control either by completion of courses of continuing education in pest control
27 approved by the board or equivalent activity approved by the board.

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1 **REGULATORY PROVISIONS**

2 10. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1950 states:

3 (a) Except as provided in section 1951¹, every licensee is required, as a condition
4 to renewal of a license, to certify that he or she has completed the continuing education
5 requirements set forth in this article. A licensee who cannot verify completion of
6 continuing education by producing certificates of activity completion, whenever requested
to do so by the Board, may be subject to disciplinary action under section 8641 of the
code.

7 (b) Each licensee is required to complete a certain number of continuing education
8 hours during the three year renewal period. The number of hours required depends on the
9 number of branches of pest control in which licenses are held. The subject matter covered
by each activity shall be designated as "technical" or "general" by the Board when the
activity is approved. Hour values shall be assigned by the Board to each approved
educational activity, in accordance with the provisions of section 1950.5.

10 ...

11 (d) Field representatives licensed in one branch of pest control shall have completed
12 16 continuing education hours, field representatives licensed in two branches of pest
13 control shall have completed 20 continuing education hours, field representatives licensed
14 in three branches of pest control shall have completed 24 continuing education hours
during each three year renewal period. In each case, a minimum of four continuing
15 education hours in a technical subject directly related to each branch of pest control held
16 by the licensee must be completed for each branch of pest control licensed, a minimum of
two hours in Integrated Pest Management must be completed by Branch 2 and/or 3
licensees renewing on or after June 30, 2010, and a minimum of eight hours must be
completed from Board approved courses on the Structural Pest Control Act, the Rules
and Regulations, or structural pest control related agencies' rules and regulations.

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18 **COSTS**

19 11. Section 125.3 of the Code states, in pertinent part, that a Board may request the
20 administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of
21 the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and
22 enforcement of the case.

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25 ¹ 16 C.C.R. § 1951 states: "In lieu of continuing education, a licensee may qualify for
26 renewal by taking and passing an examination designed by the Board to cover developments in the
27 field of pest control. Licensees who choose this method of qualifying for renewal may take this
28 examination only once, and must take the examination no earlier than one year prior to their
license expiration date. A score of 70% or higher shall be considered a passing grade on this
examination."

1 FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

2 **(Securing a License by Fraud, Deceit, or Knowing Misrepresentation of a Material Fact)**

3 12. Respondent has subjected his license to disciplinary action under sections 498 and
4 8637 of the Code in that he secured his Field Representative License by fraud, deceit, or knowing
5 misrepresentation of a material fact. The circumstances are as follows:

6 13. On or about June 15, 2014, Respondent signed his "License Renewal Application –
7 Field Representative" for Field Representative License number FR 35645. He declared under
8 penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the information was true and
9 correct, and stated that he had completed 16 hours of continuing education required for the
10 renewal of his license. Respondent's Field Representative License was subsequently renewed for a
11 period of three years.

12 14. In a letter dated November 3, 2014, mailed to Respondent's address of record, the
13 Board informed Respondent that he had been selected for a continuing education audit.
14 Respondent was directed to provide the certificates of course completion for the 16 hours of
15 continuing education claimed on his license renewal application for the renewal period of July 1,
16 2011 through June 30, 2014. Respondent was told that the requested information was due 14
17 days from the date of the letter, and that failure to comply would subject him to disciplinary action.

18 15. In a second letter dated March 3, 2015, mailed to Respondent's address of record, the
19 Board informed Respondent that he had been selected for a continuing education audit.
20 Respondent was directed to provide the certificates of course completion for the 16 hours of
21 continuing education claimed on his license renewal application for the renewal period of July 1,
22 2011 through June 30, 2014. Respondent was told that the requested information was due 14
23 days from the date of the letter, and that failure to comply would subject him to disciplinary action.

24 16. On May 11, 2015, the Board left a voicemail for Respondent asking to return the call.

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1 17. On May 13, 2015, the Board spoke with Respondent, wherein he updated his new
2 address. The Board resent the second audit letter to his new address of record and informed
3 Respondent about the certificates they requested.

4 18. On June 30, 2015, when the Board had not received any response from Respondent, a
5 final audit letter was mailed to Respondent.

6 19. On July 21, 2015, Respondent was notified via certified mail to his address of record
7 that his license would be subject to discipline for his failure to comply.

8 20. On August 6, 2015, the Board received a copy of the final audit along with a
9 handwritten note from Respondent stating "can not find copy of 2014 lost but paid online what can
10 I do?", along with three certificates which are outside the date range.

11 21. On September 8, 2015, the Board received another handwritten note from Respondent
12 indicating he had "lost all certificates when his computer crashed, can't remember the company
13 where he did the hours, looked through all his bank statements and can't find anything."

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Comply with the Provisions of the Structural Pest Control Act)

14
15 22. Respondent has subjected his license to disciplinary action under section 8641 of the
16 Code, and California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1950, in that he failed to comply with
17 the provisions of the Structural Pest Control Act, as described in paragraphs 13-21, above.
18 Respondent's conduct violated Business and Professions Code section 8593, which required
19 Respondent, as a condition to the renewal of his Field Representative License, to submit proof that
20 he completed a minimum of 16 hours of continuing education in pest control approved by the
21 Board or equivalent activity approved by the Board within the three-year renewal period.

PRAYER

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24 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
25 and that following the hearing, the Structural Pest Control Board issue a decision:


26 1. Revoking or suspending Field Representative License Number FR 35645, issued to
27 Darrell Allen Miner;
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2. Ordering Darrell Allen Miner to pay the Structural Pest Control Board the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3;

3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
