20	1. Kelli Okuma ("Complainant") brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity as		
21	the Registrar/Executive Officer of the Structural Pest Control Board, Department of Pesticide		
. 22	Regulation.

24	2. On or about March 17, 2003, the Structural Pest Control Board issued Field		
25	Representative License Number FR 35661, Branch 2, to Anthony C. Aguilar ("Respondent").		
26	The license was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will		
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1		JURISDICTION
2	3.	This Accusation is brought before the Structural Pest Control Board ("Board"),
3	Departme	nt of Pesticide Regulation, under the authority of the following laws. All section
4	references	are to the Business and Professions Code ("Code"), unless otherwise indicated.
5	4.	Code section 8620 provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may suspend or revoke a
6	license wl	nen it finds that the holder, while a licensee or applicant, has committed any acts or
7	omissions	constituting cause for disciplinary action or in lieu of a suspension may assess a civil
8	penalty.	
9	5.	Code section 8624 states:
10		"If the board suspends or revokes an operator's license and one or more branch
11	offices ar	e registered under the name of the operator, the suspension or revocation may be applied
12	to each br	anch office."
13	6.	Code section 8625 states:
14		The lapsing or suspension of a license or company registration by
15	ope vol	ration of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, or the untary surrender of a license or company registration shall not deprive the
16	board of jurisdiction to proceed with any investigation of or action or	
17	dec	ision suspending or revoking such license or registration.
18	7.	Code section 8654 states:
19		Any individual who has been denied a license for any of the reasons
20	ll lice	cified in Section 8568, or who has had his or her license revoked, or whose ense is under suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while
21	aua dua	vas under suspension, or who has been a member, officer, director, associate, alifying manager, or responsible managing employee of any partnership,
22	has has	poration, firm, or association whose application for a company registration s been denied for any of the reasons specified in Section 8568, or whose
23	wh	npany registration has been revoked as a result of disciplinary action, or ose company registration is under suspension, and while acting as such

25	sha	s for which the license or registration was denied, suspended or revoked, all be prohibited from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner,

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1	8. Code section 8593 states:		
2	The board shall require as a condition to the renewal of each operator's and field representative's license that the holder thereof submit proof		
3	satisfactory to the board that he or she has informed himself or herself of developments in the field of pest control by completion of courses of		
4	continuing education in pest control approved by the board or equivalent activity approved by the board.		
5	9. Code section 8637 states:

8	STATUTORY PROVISION		
9	10. Code section 8641 states:		
10	Failure to comply with the provisions of this chapter, or any rule or		
11	regulation adopted by the board, is a ground for disciplinary action.		
12	REGULATORY PROVISION		
13	11. California Code of Regulations, section 1950, subdivision (a), states:		
14	Except as provided in section 1951, every licensee is required, as a		
15	condition to a renewal of a license, to certify that he or she has completed the continuing education requirements set forth in this article. A licensee who		
16	cannot verify completion of continuing education by producing certificates of activity completion, whenever required to do so by the Board, may be subject to		
17	disciplinary action under section 8641 of the code.		
18	COST RECOVERY		
19	12. Code section 125.3 states, in pertinent part, that a Board may request the		
20	administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of		
21	the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and		
22	enforcement of the case.		
23	FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE		
24	(Documentation of Continuing Education Requirements)		
25	13. Respondent's license is subject to disciplinary action pursuant to Code sections 8620,		
26	8593, and 8641, in that Respondent failed to comply with Regulation section 1950, subdivision		
27	(a), by failing to provide the Board with verifiable documentation to demonstrate that he		
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1	completed 16 hours of continuing education requirements for the renewal period of July 1, 2005,
2	through June 30, 2008, as stated in his License Renewal Application, signed under penalty of
3	perjury and dated August 12, 2008.
4	SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
5	(Misrepresentation of Material Fact)
6	14. Respondent's license is subject to disciplinary action pursuant to Code section 8637,
7	in that Respondent misrepresented a material fact to the Board by stating in his License Renewal
8	Application that he completed 16 hours of continuing education requirements for the renewal
9	period of July 1, 2005, through June 30, 2008; when, in fact, he did not. Respondent signed the
10	application under penalty of perjury and dated August 12, 2008. A review of the Board's records
11	shows that Respondent falsified the License Renewal Application.
12	
13	OTHER MATTERS
14	15. Pursuant to Code section 8654, if Respondent's license is disciplined, then
15	Respondent shall be prohibited from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner, or
16	qualifying individual of any license, and any licensee which employs, elects or associates
17	Respondent in any capacity other than as a non-supervising bona fide employee shall be subject
18	to disciplinary action.
19	PRAYER
20	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
21	and that following the hearing, the Structural Pest Control Board issue a decision:
22	1. Revoking or suspending Field Representative License Number FR 35661 issued to
23	Anthony C. Aguilar.
24	2. Prohibiting Anthony C. Aguilar from serving as an officer, director, associate,
25	partner, or qualifying individual of any licensee;
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Ordering Anthony C. Aguilar to pay the Board the reasonable costs of the 3. investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Code section 125.3; and, Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper. 4.
