21	1. Susan Saylor ("Complainant") brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity as	
22	the Interim Registrar/Executive Officer of the Structural Pest Control Board, Department of	
23	Pesticide Regulation.	
24	License History	
25	2. On or about June 26, 2009, the Structural Pest Control Board issued Field	
26	Representative License Number FR 44498, Branch 2, to Jorge Alberto Sandoval	
27	("Respondent") reflecting employment with Terminix International Company L.P. at a business	
28	address of 5901 East Slauson Avenue, City of Commerce, CA 90040. On or about September 1,

2009, Field Representative License Number FR 44498 left the employ of Terminix International Company L.P. On or about September 1, 2009, Field Representative License Number FR 44498 reflected employment with Western Exterminator Company at a business address of 305 North Crescent Way, Anaheim, CA 92801. The Field Representative License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought here and will expire on June 30, 2014, unless renewed.

JURISDICTION

- 3. This Accusation is brought before the Structural Pest Control Board ("Board"), Department of Pesticide Regulation, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code ("Code") unless otherwise indicated.
- 4. Section 118, subdivision (b) of the Code provides that the expiration of a license shall not deprive the Board of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued or reinstated.
- 5. Section 8620 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may suspend or revoke a license when it finds that the holder, while a licensee or applicant, has committed any acts or omissions constituting cause for disciplinary action or in lieu of a suspension may assess a civil penalty.
 - 6. Section 8625 of the Code states:

"The lapsing or suspension of a license or company registration by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender of a license or company registration shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to proceed with any investigation of or action or disciplinary proceeding against such licensee or company, or to render a decision suspending or revoking such license or registration."

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

7. Section 490 of the Code states, in pertinent part, that the Board may suspend or revoke a license when it finds that the licensee has been convicted of a crime substantially related

to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the business or profession for which the license was issued.

8. Section 493 of the Code states:

"Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in a proceeding conducted by a board within the department pursuant to law to deny an application for a license or to suspend or revoke a license or otherwise take disciplinary action against a person who holds a license, upon the ground that the applicant or the licensee has been convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of the licensee in question, the record of conviction of the crime shall be conclusive evidence of the fact that the conviction occurred, but only of that fact, and the board may inquire into the circumstances surrounding the commission of the crime in order to fix the degree of discipline or to determine if the conviction is substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of the licensee in question."

As used in this section, "license" includes "certificate," "permit," "authority," and "registration."

9. Section 8649 of the Code states:

"Conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a structural pest control operator, or field representative, applicator, or registered company is a ground for disciplinary action. The certified record of conviction shall be conclusive evidence thereof."

- 10. Section 8650 of the Code states:
- "Acting in the capacity of a license or registered company under any of the licenses or registrations issued hereunder except:
- "(a) In the name of the licensee or registered company as set forth upon the license or registration, or
- "(b) At the address and location or place or places of business as licensed or registered or as later changed as provided in this chapter is a ground for disciplinary action."
- 11. Section 8654 of the Code states, in pertinent part:

"Any individual who . . . has had his or her license revoked, or whose license is under suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while it was under suspension, or who has been a member, officer, director, associate, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee of any partnership, corporation, firm, or association whose application for a company registration has been denied for any of the reasons specified in Section 8568, or whose company registration has been revoked as a result of disciplinary action, or whose company registration is under suspension, and while acting as such member, officer, director, associate, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee had knowledge of or participated in any of the prohibited acts for which the license or registration was denied, suspended or revoked, shall be prohibited from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee of a registered company, and the employment, election or association of such person by a registered company is a ground for disciplinary action."

12. Section 8655 of the Code states:

"A plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere made to a charge substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a structural pest control operator, field representative, applicator, or registered company is deemed to be a conviction within the meaning of this article or Section 8568 of this chapter. The board may order the license or registration suspended or revoked, or may decline to issue a license, when the time for appeal has elapsed, or the judgment of conviction has been affirmed on appeal or when an order granting probation is made suspending the imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under the provisions of Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code allowing the individual or registered company to withdraw a plea of guilty and to enter a plea of not guilty, or setting aside the verdict of guilty, or dismissing the accusation, information or indictment."

REGULATORY PROVISIONS

3. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1937.1 states, in pertinent part:

18.

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"For the purposes of denial, suspension or revocation of a license or company registration pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the code, a crime or act shall be considered to be substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a licensee or registered company under Chapter 14 of Division 3 of the code if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of such licensee or registered company to perform the functions authorized by the license or company registration in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare."

COST RECOVERY

14. Section 125.3 of the Code states, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION

(Conviction of a Substantially Related Crime)

- 15. Respondent has subjected his field representative license to disciplinary action under Sections 490 and 8649 of the Code as he was convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of an operator.
- a. On October 9, 2012, after pleading nolo contendere, Respondent was convicted of violating Penal Code Section 288(a) [lewd act upon a child], a felony, in the criminal proceeding entitled *The People of the State of California v. Jorge Alberto Sandoval* (Super. Ct. Los Angeles County, 2012, No.VA123722). Respondent was sentenced to three years in state prison, with fees and fines. The court also ordered him to register as a sex offender upon his release on parole.
- b. The circumstances surrounding the convictions are that between March 1, 2009 and October 31, 2009, Respondent willfully, unlawfully, and lewdly committed a lewd and lascivious act upon and with the body and certains parts and members thereof of A.B., a child under the age of fourteen years, with the intent of arousing, appealing to, and gratifying the lust, passions, and sexual desires of Respondent and the said child.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Field Representative License Number FR 44498, Branch 2, issued to Jorge Alberto Sandoval;
- 2. Prohibiting Jorge Alberto Sandoval from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee of a registered company;
- 3. Ordering Jorge Alberto Sandoval to pay the Board the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to section 125.3 of the Code; and
 - 4. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
