and Qualifying Manager. On or about August 23, 2010, the company registration certificate was suspended pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 8690 (failure to maintain general liability insurance). On or about January 10, 2011, the company registration certificate was further suspended for no qualifier due to suspension of the operator's license pursuant to Family Code section 17520.

- 4. On or about July 6, 2011, Respondent was served by Certified and First Class Mail copies of the Accusation No. 2011-75, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request for Discovery, and Discovery Statutes (Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7) at Respondent's address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 136, is required to be reported and maintained with the Board, which was and is: 10196 Suey Creek Road, Nipomo, CA 93444. Respondent was also served at an alternative address of P.O. Box 1901, Nipomo, Ca. 93444.
- 5. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c) and/or Business & Professions Code section 124.
- 6. On or about July 14, 2011, the aforementioned documents served at Respondent's address of record were returned by the U.S. Postal Service marked "Addressee Unknown." On or about August 8, 2011, a signed Domestic Return Receipt was sent back to the Attorney General's office acknowledging receipt of the aformentioned documents by Respondent at his alternative address of P.O. Box 1901, Nipomo, Ca. 93444.
 - 7. Government Code section 11506 states, in pertinent part:
 - (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense, and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing.
- 8. Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon him of the Accusation, and therefore waived his right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No. 2011-75.
 - 9. California Government Code section 11520 states, in pertinent part:

- (a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense or to appear at the hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent.
- 10. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board finds Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on the relevant evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this matter, as well as taking official notice of all the investigatory reports, exhibits and statements contained therein on file at the Board's offices regarding the allegations contained in Accusation No. 2011-75, finds that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 2011-75, are separately and severally, found to be true and correct by clear and convincing evidence.
- 11. Taking official notice of its own internal records, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3, it is hereby determined that the reasonable costs for Investigation and Enforcement is \$862.50 as of August 25, 2011.

DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

- Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Stephen James Redd has subjected his Operator's License No. OPR 11062 and Company Registration Certificate Number PR 5315 to discipline.
 - 2. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.
- 3. The Structural Pest Control Board is authorized to revoke Respondent's Operator's License based upon the following violations alleged in the Accusation which are supported by the evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this case.:
- a. Respondent's operator's license and company registration certificate are subject to disciplinary action under Code section 8649, in that Respondent has been convicted of the following crimes that are substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a licensee:
- On October 28, 2010, in the Superior Court, County of San Luis Obispo,
 California, in the matter entitled *People vs. Stephen J. Redd*, 2010, Case No. M000448286,
 Respondent was convicted by the Court following his plea of no contest to a violation of Vehicle

Code section 20002, subdivision (a) (willfully and unlawfully failed, refused, and neglected to locate and notify the owner of a vehicle or other property damage), a misdemeanor. The circumstances of the crime are that on June 7, 2010, Respondent caused an accident resulting in damage to someone else's property and then failed to notify the owner or leave a note providing his contact information.

2. On June 4, 2001, in the Superior Court, County of Santa Barbara, Figueroa Division, California, in the matter entitled *People vs. Stephen James Redd*, 2001, Case No. 1055681, Respondent was convicted by the court following his plea of no contest to a violation of Vehicle Code section 23152, subdivision (b) (driving a vehicle with a blood alcohol level above .08%), a misdemeanor with a prior violation of Vehicle Code section 23103 (reckless driving) The circumstances of the crime are that on or about April 14, 2001, Respondent was arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol.

<u>ORDER</u>

IT IS SO ORDERED that Operator's License No. OPR 11062, and Company Registration Certificate Number PR 5315 heretofore issued to Respondent Stephen James Redd, are revoked.

Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. The agency in its discretion may vacate the Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the statute.

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

- 4. Section 8620 of the Business and Professions Code ("Code") provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may suspend or revoke a license when it finds that the holder, while a licensee or applicant, has committed any acts or omissions constituting cause for disciplinary action or in lieu of a suspension may assess a civil penalty.
 - 5. Code section 8625 states:

The lapsing or suspension of a license or company registration by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender of a license or company registration shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to proceed with any investigation of or action or disciplinary proceeding against such licensee or company, or to render a decision suspending or revoking such license or registration.

6. Code section 8649 states:

Conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a structural pest control operator, field representative, applicator, or registered company is a ground for disciplinary action. The certified record of conviction shall be conclusive evidence thereof.

COST RECOVERY

7. Code section 125.3 states, in pertinent part, that a Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Criminal Convictions)

8. Respondent's operator's license and company registration certificate are subject to disciplinary action under Code section 8649, in that Respondent has been convicted of the

following crimes that are substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a licensee:

- a. On October 28, 2010, in the Superior Court, County of San Luis Obispo, California, in the matter entitled *People vs. Stephen J. Redd*, 2010, Case No. M000448286, Respondent was convicted by the Court following his plea of no contest to a violation of Vehicle Code section 20002, subdivision (a) (willfully and unlawfully failed, refused, and neglected to locate and notify the owner of a vehicle or other property damage), a misdemeanor. The circumstances of the crime are that on June 7, 2010, Respondent caused an accident resulting in damage to someone else's property and then failed to notify the owner or leave a note providing his contact information.
- b. On June 4, 2001, in the Superior Court, County of Santa Barbara, Figueroa Division, California, in the matter entitled *People vs. Stephen James Redd*, 2001, Case No. 1055681, Respondent was convicted by the court following his plea of no contest to a violation of Vehicle Code section 23152, subdivision (b) (driving a vehicle with a blood alcohol level above .08%), a misdemeanor with a prior violation of Vehicle Code section 23103 (reckless driving) The circumstances of the crime are that on or about April 14, 2001, Respondent was arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol.

OTHER MATTERS

- 9. Code section 8620 provides, in pertinent part, that a respondent may request that a civil penalty of not more than \$5,000 by assessed in lieu of an actual suspension of 1 to 19 days, or not more than \$10,000 for an actual suspension of 20 to 45 days. Such request must be made at the time of the hearing and must be noted in the proposed decision. The proposed decision shall not provide that a civil penalty shall be imposed in lieu of a suspension.
- 9. Pursuant to Code section 8654, if discipline is imposed on Operator's License Number OPR 11062 issued to Respondent, then Stephen J. Redd, shall be prohibited from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner or responsible managing employee of a licensee, and any licensee which employs, elects, or associates him shall be subject to disciplinary action.
