Complainant brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity as the 23 Registrar/Executive Officer of the Structural Pest Control Board ("Board"), Department of 24 Consumer Affairs. 25 2. On or about May 3, 2006, the Board issued Operator's License Number OPR 11312, 26 Branch 2, to Jeffrey J. Fuentes ("Respondent Fuentes"). On or about February 29, 2008, 27 Respondent Fuentes became a Partner and Qualifying Manager of Strike First Exterminator Co. 28 The Operator's License was suspended on June 9, 2015, for failure to maintain general liability

manager, or responsible managing employee had knowledge of or participated in any

of the prohibited acts for which the license or registration was denied, suspended or revoked, shall be prohibited from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee of a registered company, and the employment, election or association of such person by a registered company is a ground for disciplinary action.

8. Code section 8641 states:

Failure to comply with the provisions of this chapter, or any rule or regulation adopted by the board, or the furnishing of a report of inspection without the making of a bona fide inspection of the premises for wood-destroying pests or organisms, or furnishing a notice of work completed prior to the completion of the work specified in the contract, is a ground for disciplinary action.

9. Code section 8593 states:

The board shall require as a condition to the renewal of each operator's and field representative's license that the holder submit proof satisfactory to the board that he or she has informed himself or herself of developments in the field of pest control either by completion of courses of continuing education in pest control approved by the board or equivalent activity approved by the board. In lieu of submitting that proof, the licenseholder, if he or she so desires, may take and successfully complete an examination given by the board, designed to test his or her knowledge of developments in the field of pest control since the issuance of his or her license.

The board shall develop a correspondence course or courses with any educational institution or institutions as it deems appropriate. This course may be used to fulfill the requirements of this section. The institution may charge a reasonable fee for each course.

The board may charge a fee for the taking of an examination in each branch of pest control pursuant to this section in an amount sufficient to cover the cost of administering each examination, provided, however, that in no event shall the fee exceed fifty dollars (\$50) for each examination.

10. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section ("Regulation") 1950 states, in pertinent part:

- (a) Except as provided in section 1951, every licensee is required, as a condition to renewal of a license, to certify that he or she has completed the continuing education requirements set forth in this article. A licensee who cannot verify completion of continuing education by producing certificates of activity completion, whenever requested to do so by the Board, may be subject to disciplinary action under section 8641 of the code.
- (b) Each licensee is required to complete a certain number of continuing education hours during the three year renewal period. The number of hours required depends on the number of branches of pest control in which licenses are held. The subject matter covered by each activity shall be designated as "technical" or "general" by the Board when the activity is approved. Hour values shall be assigned by the Board to each approved educational activity, in accordance with the provisions of section 1950.5.

(d) Field representatives licensed in one branch of pest control shall have completed 16 continuing education hours, field representatives licensed in two branches of pest control shall have completed 20 continuing education hours, field representatives licensed in three branches of pest control shall have completed 24 continuing education hours during each three year renewal period. In each case, a minimum of four continuing education hours in a technical subject directly related to each branch of pest control held by the licensee must be completed for each branch of pest control licensed, a minimum of two hours in Integrated Pest Management must be completed by Branch 2 and/or 3 licensees renewing on or after June 30, 2010, and a minimum of eight hours must be completed from Board approved courses on the Structural Pest Control Act, the Rules and Regulations, or structural pest control related agencies' rules and regulations. . . .

COST RECOVERY

11. Code section 125.3 states, in pertinent part, that a Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Verify Completion of Continuing Education)

- 12. In or around June 2014, Respondent Fuentes submitted a license renewal application to the Board. On or about June 28, 2014, Respondent Fuentes certified under penalty of perjury on the application form that he completed 16 hours of continuing education during his last renewal period.
- 13. On November 3, 2014, March 3, 2015, May 18, 2015, and July 23, 2015, a Board representative sent Respondent Fuentes written requests for copies of his continuing education certificates for the renewal period July 1, 2011, through June 30, 2014. Respondent Fuentes was advised that his failure to verify his continuing education hours or to supply the requested information could subject his operator license to disciplinary action.
- 14. Respondent Fuentes is subject to discipline pursuant to Code section 8641, in that he failed to comply with Code Section 8593 and Regulation section 1950(a) by failing to verify that he completed courses of continuing education in pest control approved by the Board. Specifically, Respondent Fuentes failed to submit copies of his continuing education certificates for the renewal period July 1, 2011, through June 30, 2014, as requested by the Board representative.

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OTHER MATTERS

- 15. Code section 8620 provides, in pertinent part, that a respondent may request that a civil penalty of not more than \$5,000 be assessed in lieu of an actual suspension of 1 to 19 days, or not more than \$10,000 for an actual suspension of 20 to 45 days. Such request must be made at the time of the hearing and must be noted in the proposed decision. The proposed decision shall not provide that a civil penalty shall be imposed in lieu of a suspension.
- 16. Pursuant to Code section 8654, if discipline is imposed on Operator License Number OPR 11312, issued to Respondent Jeffrey J. Fuentes, Jeffrey J. Fuentes shall be prohibited from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee for any registered company during the time the discipline is imposed, and any registered company which employs, elects, or associates him shall be subject to disciplinary action.
- 17. Pursuant to Code section 8624, if discipline in the form of suspension or revocation is imposed on Operator License Number OPR 11312, issued to Respondent Fuentes as the Qualifying Manager of Respondent First Strike Exterminator Co., the suspension or revocation may also be applied to the Company Registration.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Structural Pest Control Board issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Operator License Number OPR 11312, issued to Jeffrey J. Fuentes:
- 2. Prohibiting Jeffrey J. Fuentes from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner, qualifying manager or responsible managing employee of any registered company during the period that discipline is imposed on Operator License Number OPR 11312, issued to Jeffrey J. Fuentes;
- 3. Revoking or suspending Company Registration No. PR 5544, issued to Strike First Exterminator Co.;

- 4. Ordering Jeffrey J. Fuentes to pay the Structural Pest Control Board the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and,
 - 5. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
