19	PARTIES
20	1. Susan Saylor (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity as
21	the Registrar/Executive Officer of the Structural Pest Control Board, Department of Consumer
22	Affairs.
23	2. On or about October 1, 2010, the Structural Pest Control Board issued Operator's
24	License Number OPR 12094 in Branch 2 to Tschaikowsky Brown (Respondent). The Operator's
25	License was placed on inactive status on July 30, 2013. The Operator's License was in full force
26	and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on June 30, 2016,
27	unless renewed.
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On or about October 17, 2007, the Structural Pest Control Board issued Field
 Representative License Number FR 42419 in Branch 2 to Respondent. On August 19, 2009, the
 Field Representative License was upgraded to include Branches 2 and 3. On October 1, 2010, the
 Field Representative License was downgraded to include Branch 3 only due to the issuance of a
 Branch 2 Operator's License. The Field Representative License was in full force and effect at all
 times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on June 30, 2016, unless renewed.

4. On or about June 24, 2005, the Structural Pest Control Board issued Applicator's
License Number RA 43940 in Branches 2 and 3 to Respondent. On October 17, 2007, the
Applicator's License was downgraded to include Branch 3 only due to the issuance of a Branch 2
Operator's License, and was placed on inactive status. The Applicator License was cancelled on
June 24, 2008.

## JURISDICTION

5. This Accusation is brought before the Structural Pest Control Board (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.

- 6. Section 8620 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may suspend or
  revoke a license when it finds that the holder, while a licensee or applicant, has committed any
  acts or omissions constituting cause for disciplinary action or in lieu of a suspension may assess a
  civil penalty.
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7. Section 8625 of the Code states:

The lapsing or suspension of a license or company registration by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender of a license or company registration shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to proceed with any investigation of or action or disciplinary proceeding against such licensee or company, or to render a decision suspending or revoking such license or registration.

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STATUTORY PROVISIONS

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8. Section 498 of the Code states:

A board may revoke, suspend, or otherwise restrict a license on the ground that the licensee secured the license by fraud, deceit, or knowing misrepresentation of a material fact or by knowingly omitting to state a material fact. 9. Section 8624 of the Code states:

If the board suspends or revokes an operator's license and one or more branch offices are registered under the name of the operator, the suspension or revocation may be applied to each branch office.

If the operator is the qualifying manager, a partner, responsible officer, or owner of a registered structural pest control company, the suspension or revocation may be applied to the company registration.

The performance by any partnership, corporation, firm, association, or registered company of any act or omission constituting a cause for disciplinary action, likewise constitutes a cause for disciplinary action against any licensee who, at the time the act or omission occurred, was the qualifying manager, a partner, responsible officer, or owner of the partnership, corporation, firm, association, or registered company whether or not he or she had knowledge of, or participated in, the prohibited act or omission.

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10. Section 8637 of the Code states: "Misrepresentation of a material fact by the

11 applicant in obtaining a license or company registration is a ground for disciplinary action."

11. Section 8641 of the Code provides that failure to comply with the provisions of the

13 Business and Professions Code, or any rule or regulation adopted by the Board, is a ground for

14 disciplinary action.

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12. Section 8654 of the Code states:

Any individual who has been denied a license for any of the reasons specified in Section 8568, or who has had his or her license revoked, or whose license is under suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while it was under suspension, or who has been a member, officer, director, associate, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee of any partnership, corporation, firm, or association whose application for a company registration has been denied for any of the reasons specified in Section 8568, or whose company registration has been revoked as a result of disciplinary action, or whose company registration is under suspension, and while acting as such member, officer, director, associate, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee had knowledge of or participated in any of the prohibited acts for which the license or registration was denied, suspended or revoked, shall be prohibited from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee of a registered company, and the employment, election or association of such person by a registered company is a ground for disciplinary action.

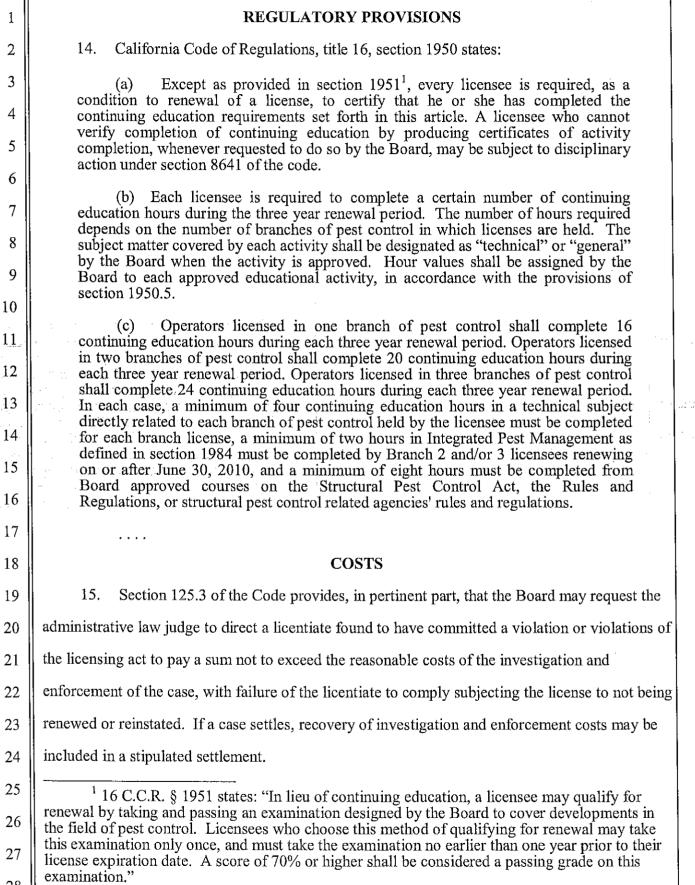
13. Section 8593 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board shall require as a

25 condition to the renewal of each operator's and field representative's license that the holder

26 submit proof satisfactory to the board that he or she has informed himself or herself of

27 developments in the field of pest control either by completion of courses of continuing education

28 in pest control approved by the board or equivalent activity approved by the board.



## FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Securing a License by Fraud, Deceit, or Knowing Misrepresentation of a Material Fact)

Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under sections 498 and 8637 of the Code 16. in that he secured his Operator's License by fraud, deceit, or knowing misrepresentation of a material fact. The circumstances are as follows:

17. On or about June 19, 2013, Respondent signed the "License Renewal Application-Operator" for Operator's License number OPR 12094. Declaring under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that his information was true and correct, Respondent stated that he completed 20 hours of continuing education required for the renewal of his license. Respondent's Operator's License was subsequently renewed for a period of three years. 10

18. In a letter dated January 4, 2014, mailed to Respondent's address of record, the Board 11 informed Respondent that he had been selected for a continuing education audit. Respondent was 12 directed to provide the certificates of course completion for the 20 hours of continuing education 13 claimed on his license renewal application. Respondent was told that the requested information 14 was due 14 days from the date of the letter, and that failure to comply would subject him to 15 disciplinary action. After Respondent failed to respond to the letter, a second letter dated March 16 21, 2014, was mailed to Respondent. The letter was returned to the Board by the U.S. Postal 17 Service marked "Return to Sender - Attempted - Not Known - Unable to Forward." Respondent 18 failed to comply. 19

19. In a third letter dated April 17, 2014, sent to Respondent via Certified Mail to two 2021 alternate addresses, Respondent was directed to provide the requested information within 14 days. Both letters were returned to the Board marked "Return to Sender - Undeliverable as Addressed." 22

In a fourth letter dated May 14, 2014, sent to Respondent's address of record and two 23 20. alternate addresses via Certified Mail, Respondent was warned that as a result of his ongoing non-24 compliance with the continuing education audit, disciplinary action would be taken against his 25 license. All three letters were returned to the Board undelivered. 26

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1	SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
2	(Failure to Comply With the Provisions of the Structural Pest Control Act)
3	21. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 8641 of the Code, and
4	California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1950, in that he failed to comply with the
5	provisions of the Structural Pest Control Act, as described in paragraph 20, above. Respondent's
6	conduct violated Business and Professions Code section 8593, which required Respondent, as a
7	condition to the renewal of his Operator's License, to submit proof that he complete a minimum
8	of 16 hours of continuing education in pest control approved by the Board or equivalent activity
9	approved by the Board within the three-year renewal period.
- 10	OTHER MATTERS
11	Pursuant to section 8624 of the Code, if discipline is imposed on Operator's License
12	No. OPR 12094 issued to Respondent, Tschaikowsky Brown shall be prohibited from serving as
13	an officer, director, associate, partner, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee for
14	any registered company during the time the discipline is imposed, and any registered company
15	which employs, elects, or associates Tschaikowsky Brown shall be subject to disciplinary action.
16	23. Pursuant to section 8654 of the Code, if discipline is imposed on Operator's License
17	No. OPR 12094, or Field Representative License Number FR 42419 issued to Respondent,
18	Tschaikowsky Brown shall be prohibited from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner,
19	qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee of a registered company, and the
20	employment, election or association of Tschaikowsky Brown is a ground for disciplinary action.
21	PRAYER
22	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
23	and that following the hearing, the Structural Pest Control Board issue a decision:
24	1. Revoking or suspending Operator's License Number OPR 12094, issued to
25	Tschaikowsky Brown;
26	2. Revoking or suspending Field Representative License Number FR 42419, issued to
27	Tschaikowsky Brown;
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3. Ordering Tschaikowsky Brown to pay the Structural Pest Control Board the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper. 4.
