**STIPULATION FOR A
PROBATIONARY LICENSE**

John H. Park, applicant for a structural pest control operator's license (hereinafter applicant or respondent), and Kelli Okuma, Executive Officer, Structural Pest Control Board (Board), hereby stipulate as follows:

1. This applicant is not presently licensed as a structural pest control applicator, field representative or an operator with the Board in the State of California.
2. On October 19, 2010, applicant was issued Citation and Fine No. 11-22 in the amount of \$2,500 for violation of section 8550 of the Business and Professions Code. The fine has not been paid.

ORDER

Applicant, John H. Park is hereby granted a probationary Operator's license. The license is placed on three years probation on the following terms and conditions:

1. Compliance with all provisions of the Business and Professions Code, Division 3, Chapter 14, Structural Pest Control Operators, and California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Professional and Vocational Regulations, Division 19. Applicant shall obey all laws and rules relating to the practice of structural pest control.
2. Obey all Local, State and Federal laws.
3. Quarterly Reports. Applicant shall file quarterly reports with the Board during the period of probation.

4. Tolling of Probation. Should Applicant leave California to reside outside this state, Applicant must notify the Board in writing of the dates of departure and return. Periods of residency or practice outside the state shall not apply to reduction of the probationary period.
5. Notice to Employees. Applicant shall upon or before the effective date of this Order, post or circulate a notice to all employees involved in structural pest control operations which accurately recite the terms and conditions of probation. Applicant shall be responsible for said notice being immediately available to said employees. "Employees" as used in this provision includes all full-time, part-time, and temporary and relief employees and independent contractors employed or hired at any time during probation.
6. Completion of Probation. Upon successful completion of probation, Applicant's operator license will become fully effective.
7. Violation of Probation. Should Applicant violate probation in any respect, the Board, after giving Applicant notice and an opportunity to be heard, may revoke the probationary license through an administrative hearing process.
8. Random Inspections. Applicant shall reimburse the Board for one random inspection per quarter by the Board specialists during the period of probation not to exceed \$125 per inspection.
9. Cite and Fine Reimbursement. Applicant shall pay to Board the amount of \$2,500 for the outstanding Citation and Fine No. CF 11-22. Applicant shall be permitted to pay the fine in a payment plan approved by the Board, with payments to be completed no later than three months prior to the expiration date of the operator's license.

ACCEPTANCE

I have carefully read the Order. I understand the Order and the effect it will have on my operator's license. I enter into this Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to be bound by the Order of the Board.
