24	9791 to Juan C. Jimenez (Respondent). The Operator's License was in full force and effect at all	
25	times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on June 30, 2024, unless renewed.

1	JURISDICTION			
2	3. This Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following			
3	laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise			
4	indicated.			
5	4. Section 8625 of the Code states:			
6	The lapsing or suspension of a license or company registration by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender of a license or company registration shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to proceed with any investigation of or action or disciplinary proceeding against such licensee or company, or to render a decision suspending or revoking such license or registration.			
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10	STATUTORY PROVISIONS			
11	5. Section 490 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that a board may suspend or			
12	revoke a license on the ground that the licensee has been convicted of a crime substantially			
13	related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the business or profession for which the			
14	license was issued.			
15	6. Section 8620 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may suspend or			
16	revoke a license when it finds that the holder, while a licensee or applicant, has committed any			
17	acts or omissions constituting cause for disciplinary action or in lieu of a suspension may assess a			
18	civil penalty.			
19	7. Section 8649 of the Code states:			
20	Conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a structural pest control operator, field representative, applicator, or			
21 22	registered company is a ground for disciplinary action. The certified record of conviction shall be conclusive evidence thereof.			
23	8. Section 8654 of the Code states:			
24	Any individual who has been denied a license for any of the reasons specified			
25	in Section 8568, or who has had his or her license revoked, or whose license is under suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while it was under			
26	suspension, or who has been a member, officer, director, associate, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee of any partnership, corporation, firm, or association whose application for a company registration has been denied for any of the reasons specified in Section 8568, or whose company registration has been revoked as a result of disciplinary action, or whose company registration is under suspension, and while acting as such member, officer, director, associate, qualifying

6	A plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere

8	chapter. The board may order the license or registration suspended or revoked, or may decline to issue a license, when the time for appeal has elapsed, or the judgment	
9	of conviction has been affirmed on appeal or when an order granting probation is made suspending the imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under

14	10. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1937.1(a) states:	
15 16 17	For purposes of denial, suspension or revocation of a license or company registration, pursuant to section 141, Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475), Section 8623, Section 8649, or Section 8655 of the code, a crime, professional misconduct, or act shall be considered to be substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a licensee or registered company under Chapter 14 of Division 3 of the code if, to a substantial degree, it evidences present or potential unfitness of	
18 19	such licensee or registered company to perform the functions authorized by the license or company registration in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare.

21	11. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the	
22	administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation or violations of	
23	the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and	
24	enforcement of the case, with failure of the licensee to comply subjecting the license to not being	
25	renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be	
26	included in a stipulated settlement.

1	CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE		
2	(January 30, 2023 Criminal Conviction - Workers' Compensation Fraud)		
3	12. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code sections 490 and 8649, in		
4	conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1937.1(a), in that Respondent		
5	has been convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a		
6	licensed structural pest control operator. On or about January 30, 2023, in a criminal proceeding		
7	entitled The People of the State of California vs. Juan Carlos Jimenez, in Superior Court of		
8	California, County of Los Angeles, Case No. BA493965, Respondent pled nolo contendere and		
9	was convicted of violating Insurance Code section 11760(a) (workers' compensation fraud), a		
10	felony. Respondent was sentenced to serve one day in jail, placed on probation for two years		
11	with terms and conditions, ordered to perform 60 days of community service, pay restitution to		
12	the victim in the sum of \$1,586,805, and pay fines and fees.		
13	The investigation revealed that Respondent was the owner of Legacy Construction, a		
14	licensed general contractor in La Puente, CA. From July 2013 to January 2018, Respondent		
15	willfully underreported his payroll by \$3,365,301.19 in order to reduce insurance premiums. As		
16	part of the scheme, Respondent paid his employees in cash and did not withhold payroll tax		
17	deductions. Respondent did not report wages to the Workers' Compensation Insurance (WCI)		
18	carriers and the California Employment Development Department. As a result of Respondent's		
19	underreporting, the insurance carriers sustained premium losses totaling \$1,251,408.67.		
20	DISCIPLINE CONSIDERATIONS		
21	13. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent,		
22	Complainant alleges the following:		
23	a. On or about May 30, 2013, in a prior disciplinary action titled <i>In the Matter of the</i>		
24	Accusation Against: Bug Wiser; Juan C. Jimenez Owner/Qualifying Manager and Juan Jimenez		
25	before the Board in Case Number 2012-38, Respondent's Company Registration Certificate No.		
26	PR 3191 and Operator's License No. OPR 9791, were revoked. However, the revocations were		
27	stayed and Respondent's certificate and license were placed on probation for three (3) years with		
28	certain terms and conditions. That decision is now final.		
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b. On or about November 8, 2018, Operator's License No. OPR 9791 was issued a \$150
 fine levied by the Los Angeles County Agricultural Commissioner, File No. SCP-LA-18/19-024,
 for violation of section 8505.17(c) of the Business and Professions Code. The fine was paid on
 January 11, 2019.
 c. On or about March 8, 2021, Operator's License No. OPR 9791 was issued a \$100

fine levied by the Los Angeles County Agricultural Commissioner, File No. SCP-LA-20/21-039,
for violation of section 8505.17(c) of the Business and Professions Code. The fine was paid on
July 29, 2021.

OTHER MATTERS

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10 14. Section 8620 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that a respondent may request
that a civil penalty of not more than \$5,000 be assessed in lieu of an actual suspension of 1 to 19
days, or not more than \$10,000 for an actual suspension of 20 to 45 days. Such request must be
made at the time of the hearing and must be noted in the proposed decision. The proposed
decision shall not provide that a civil penalty shall be imposed in lieu of a suspension.

15 15. Pursuant to section 8654, if discipline is imposed on Operator's License Number OPR
9791 issued to Respondent, Respondent shall be prohibited from serving as an officer, director,
associate, partner, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee for any registered
company during the time the discipline is imposed, and any registered company which employs,
elects, or associates Juan C. Jimenez, shall be subject to disciplinary action.

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 PRAYER

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 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,

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 and that following the hearing, the Structural Pest Control Board issue a decision:

Revoking or suspending Operator's License Number OPR 9791, issued to Juan C.
 Jimenez;

Prohibiting Juan C. Jimenez from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner,
 qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee of any registered company during the
 period that discipline is imposed on Operator's License Number OPR 9791 issued to Juan C.
 Jimenez.

1	3. Ordering Juan C. Jimenez to pay the Structural Pest Control Board the reasonable		
2	costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions		
3	Code section 125.3; and,		
4	4. Taking such other an	d further action as deemed necessary and proper.
