## CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(January 13, 2011 Criminal Conviction for Burglary)

Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under sections 490 and 8649, in that he 13. was convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, duties and functions of a licensed field representative or applicator. The circumstances are as follows.

On or about December 29, 2010, Respondent was detained by loss prevention 14. 8 personnel at the Kohl's Department Store in San Marcos, California. He was subsequently 9 arrested by the San Diego County Sheriff's Department and charged with various shoplifting 10 related offenses. 11

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On or about January 3, 2011 felony criminal complaint number CN 286325 was filed 15. in the San Diego Superior Court, North County Division. Respondent was charged with the 13 following violations: Penal Code section 211, robbery, a felony; Penal Code section 459, 14 burglary, a felony; Penal Code section 496 (a), receiving stolen property, a felony; Penal Code 15 section 466, possession of burglary tools, a misdemeanor. 16

On January 13, 2011, Respondent entered a plea of guilty to the felony violation of 16. 17 Penal Code Sec. 459, burglary. The other charges were dismissed as a result of a plea agreement. 18 As part of his criminal sentencing, Respondent was placed on three years of formal probation, 19 sentenced to 180 days in the County jail, and ordered to pay fees, fines, and restitution. 20

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, 22 and that following the hearing, the Structural Pest Control Board issue a decision: 23

Revoking or suspending Field Representative License Number FR 44922, issued to 1. 24 David Billy Misa; 25

Revoking or suspending Applicator License Number RA 45402, issued to David Billy 2. 26 Misa; 27

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Ordering David Billy Misa to pay the Structural Pest Control Board the reasonable 3. costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper. 4. 5/4/11 DATED: WILLIAM H.
