A plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere made to a charge substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a structural pest control operator, field representative, applicator, or registered company is deemed to be a conviction within the meaning of this article or Section 8568 of this chapter. The board may order the license or registration suspended or revoked, or may decline to issue a license, when the time for appeal has elapsed, or the judgment of conviction has been affirmed on appeal or when an order granting probation is made suspending the imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under the provisions of Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code allowing the individual or registered company to withdraw a plea of guilty and to enter a plea of not guilty, or setting aside the verdict of guilty, or dismissing the accusation, information or indictment.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in a proceeding conducted by a board-within the department pursuant to law to deny an application for a license or to suspend or revoke a license or otherwise take disciplinary action against a person who holds a license, upon the ground that the applicant or the licensee has been convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of the licensee in question, the record of conviction of the crime shall be conclusive evidence of the fact that the conviction occurred, but only of that fact, and the board may inquire into the circumstances surrounding the commission of the crime in order to fix the degree of discipline or to determine if the conviction is substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of the licensee in question.

As used in this section, "license" includes "certificate," "permit," "authority," and "registration."

CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(October 10, 2008 Criminal Conviction for Petty Theft on September 10, 2008) Respondent has subjected his license to disciplinary action under sections 15. 3 490 and 8649 of the Code in that Respondent was convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a registered applicator. The circumstances are as 5 follows: 6

On or about October 10, 2008, in a criminal proceeding entitled a. 7 People of the State of California v. Nicholas Christopher Siperly, in Orange County Superior 8 Court, case number 08NM12845, Respondent pled guilty to violating Penal Code section 484(a)-9 488, petty theft, a misdemeanor. 10

As a result of the conviction, on or about October 10, 2008, b. 11 Respondent was sentenced to ten days in the county jail (or 10 days Cal Trans/Physical Labor in 12 lieu of jail), three years informal probation, and payment of fines and fees in the amount of 13 \$120.00. On or about January 6, 2009, Respondent's probation was revoked for failure to 14 provide proof of completion of the 10 days Cal Trans work service. A \$15,000 bench warrant 15 was issued and remains active. 16

The facts that led to the conviction were that on or about the c. 17 afternoon of September 10, 2008, Respondent was observed by a loss prevention officer at a 1.8 Buena Park Kohl's department store entering the store, selecting men's clothing from racks at 19 random, and taking them to a dressing room. Respondent was carrying a backpack when he 20 entered the dressing room. When Respondent exited the dressing room, the backpack looked 21 noticeably fuller. Respondent left the store without paying for the merchandise. The loss 22 prevention officer contacted law enforcement. Detectives from the Buena Park Police 23 Department intercepted and detained Respondent and his girlfriend at a Carl's Jr. 300 feet away 24 from Kohl's. The detectives conducted a consensual search of Respondent and his backpack and 25 they were not able to locate any of the merchandise, however, Respondent was in possession of a 26 Kohl's gift card and receipt in the amount of \$162.22. After questioning both, Respondent's 27 girlfriend finally confessed that she and Respondent planned to steal the clothing from Kohl's, 28

1	return it for store credit, then take the gift card to a Fullerton pawn shop where they would	
2	receive cash at 50 percent of the card's value.
