20	1. Complainant brings this First Amended Accusation solely in her official capacity as	
21	the Assistant Executive Officer of the Structural Pest Control Board ("Board"), Department of	
22	Pesticide Regulation.	
23	2. On or about September 25, 2009, the Board issued Applicator License Number	
24	RA 50355 to John E. Penton ("Respondent"). The license was in full force and effect at all times	
25	relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on September 25, 2012, unless renewed.	
26	STATUTORY PROVISIONS	
27	3. Business and Professions Code ("Code") section 8620 provides, in pertinent part, that	
28	the Board may suspend or revoke a license when it finds that the holder, while a licensee or

applicant, has committed any acts or omissions constituting cause for disciplinary action or in lieu

of a suspension may assess a civil penalty.

4. Code section 8654 states:

Any individual who has been denied a license for any of the reasons specified in Section 8568, or who has had his or her license revoked, or whose license is under suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while it was under suspension, or who has been a member, officer, director, associate, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee of any partnership, corporation, firm, or association whose application for a company registration has been denied for any of the reasons specified in Section 8568, or whose company registration has been revoked as a result of disciplinary action, or whose company registration is under suspension, and while acting as such member, officer, director, associate, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee had knowledge of or participated in any of the prohibited acts for which the license or registration was denied, suspended or revoked, shall be prohibited from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee of a registered company, and the employment, election or association of such person by a registered company is a ground for disciplinary action.

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Code section 8625 states:

The lapsing or suspension of a license or company registration by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender of a license or company registration shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to proceed with any investigation of or action or disciplinary proceeding against such licensee or company, or to render a decision suspending or revoking such license or registration.

6. Code section 8641 states:

Failure to comply with the provisions of this chapter, or any rule or regulation adopted by the board, or the furnishing of a report of inspection without the making of a bona fide inspection of the premises for wood-destroying pests or organisms, or furnishing a notice of work completed prior to the completion of the work specified in the contract, is a ground for disciplinary action.

7. Code section 8651 states:

The performing or soliciting of structural pest control work, the inspecting for structural or household pests, or the applying of any pesticide, chemical, or allied substance for the purpose of eliminating, exterminating, controlling, or preventing structural pests in branches of pest control other than those for which the operator, field representative, or applicator is licensed or the company is registered is a ground for disciplinary action.

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Code section 125.3 provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the

administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of

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the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

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CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unlicensed Activity)

9. Respondent's applicator license is subject to discipline under Code section 8651, in that in 2009 and 2010, Respondent engaged in pest control work in a branch other than that for which he was licensed.

OTHER MATTERS

9 10. Code section 8620 provides, in pertinent part, that a respondent may request that a 10 civil penalty of not more than \$5,000 be assessed in lieu of an actual suspension of 1 to 19 days, 11 or not more than \$10,000 for an actual suspension of 20 to 45 days. Such request must be made 12 at the time of the hearing and must be noted in the proposed decision. The proposed decision 13 shall not provide that a civil penalty shall be imposed in lieu of a suspension.

14 11. Pursuant to Code section 8654, if discipline is imposed on Applicator License No.
15 RA 50355, issued to Respondent, then Respondent shall be prohibited from serving as an officer,
16 director, associate, partner or responsible managing employee of a registered company, and any
17 licensee which employs, elects, or associates Respondent shall be subject to disciplinary action.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein
 alleged, and that following the hearing, the Structural Pest Control Board issue a decision:

Revoking or suspending Applicator License Number RA 50355, issued to John E.
 Penton;

23 2. Revoking or suspending any other license for which John E. Penton is furnishing the
24 qualifying experience or appearance;

Prohibiting John E. Penton from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner,
 qualifying manager or responsible managing employee of any registered company during the
 period that discipline is imposed on Applicator License Number RA 50355, issued to John E.
 Penton;

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Ordering John E. Penton to pay the Structural Pest Control Board the reasonable costs 4. of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and, Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper. 5.
