**STIPULATION FOR A
PROBATIONARY LICENSE**

Jake Ignacio Anicete, applicant for a structural pest control applicator license (hereinafter Applicant), and William H. Douglas, Interim Executive Officer, Structural Pest Control Board (Board), hereby stipulate as follows:

1. This Applicant is not presently licensed as a structural pest control applicator, field representative or an operator with the Board in the State of California.
2. On April 7, 2011, the Applicant successfully passed the applicator license examination. Question number 11 on the application asked: *"Have you ever been convicted of a felony or of a misdemeanor other than minor traffic infractions?"* The Applicant checked the box marked "yes" next to question number 11, and wrote "I was with a friend – attempted unlawful driving or taking of a vehicle."
3. The Applicant was convicted on April 22, 2002 – Napa, California, of the following misdemeanor (per 17PC): 459 PC (2 counts) – Burglary. Defendant was sentenced to 36 months formal probation, 90 days in jail and restitution (Imposition of sentence suspended).
4. The Applicant was convicted on September 1, 2004 – Vallejo, California, of the following misdemeanor: 273.6(A) PC – Violation of court order to prevent domestic violence. Defendant was sentenced to 3 years summary probation and 10 days in jail. On August 25, 2006, probation was terminated and conviction was set aside and dismissed per section 1203.4 PC.
5. The Applicant was convicted on November 29, 2004 – Vallejo, California, of the following felony: 496D (A) PC – Possess stolen vehicle. Defendant was sentenced to 36 months formal probation and 365 days in jail. On August 25, 2006, petition was granted to reduce to misdemeanor per section 17 PC, and conviction was set aside and dismissed per section 1203.4 PC.

6. The Applicant was convicted on November 23, 2009 – Napa, California, of the following felony: 10851(A) VC – Take vehicle without owner’s consent/vehicle theft. Defendant was sentenced to 3 years formal probation and 120 days in jail.

ORDER


Applicant, Jake Ignacio Anicete is hereby granted a probationary applicator’s license. The license is placed on three years probation on the following terms and conditions:

1. Compliance with all provisions of the Business and Professions Code, Division 3, Chapter 14, Structural Pest Control Operators, and California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Professional and Vocational Regulations, Division 19. Applicant shall obey all laws and rules relating to the practice of structural pest control.
2. Obey all Local, State and Federal laws.
3. Quarterly Reports. Applicant shall file quarterly reports with the Board during the period of probation.
4. Tolling of Probation. Should applicant leave California to reside outside this state, Applicant must notify the Board in writing of the dates of departure and return. Periods of residency or practice outside the state shall not apply to reduction of the probationary period.
5. Notice to Employers. Applicant shall notify all present and prospective employers of the terms, conditions and restrictions imposed on Applicant by said Order. Within 30 days of the effective date of this Order, and within 15 days of Applicant undertaking new employment, Applicant shall cause his employer to report to the Board in writing acknowledging the employer has read the Order in this matter.
6. Completion of Probation. Upon successful completion of probation, Applicant’s applicator license will become fully effective.
7. Violation of Probation. Should Applicant violate probation in any respect, the Board, after giving Applicant notice and an opportunity to be heard, may revoke the probationary license through an administrative hearing process.
8. Field Representative’s License. Should Applicant apply for a field representative license and pass the examination, the Board shall issue a field representative license, which shall be immediately placed on probation for the same duration and under the same terms and conditions as set forth in this Order.

ACCEPTANCE

I have carefully read the Order. I understand the Order and the effect it will have on my applicator license. I enter into this Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to be bound by the Order of the Board.
