**STIPULATION FOR A
PROBATIONARY LICENSE**

Marquette DeShawn Jones, applicant for a structural pest control applicator license (hereinafter applicant or respondent), and William H. Douglas, Interim Executive Officer, Structural Pest Control Board (Board), hereby stipulate as follows:

1. This applicant is not presently licensed as a structural pest control applicator, field representative or an operator with the Board in the State of California.
2. On June 29, 2011, the applicant successfully passed the applicator license examination. Question number 11 on the application asked: *"Have you ever been convicted of a felony or of a misdemeanor other than minor traffic infractions?"* The applicant checked the box marked "yes" next to question number 11 and attached a separate description of two convictions: 2002 for assault with a deadly weapon from a fight at a party, and 2008 for commercial burglary from a Wal-Mart. The applicant signed the application, attesting that he had read and understood the complete application and declared that all of the information contained in his application was true and accurate.
3. The applicant was convicted January 15, 2002 – Los Angeles, California, of the following felony: 245 (A)(1) PC – Force/great bodily injury likely. Defendant was sentenced to a suspended six year prison term, received 365 days jail and 3 years probation.
4. The applicant was convicted February 21, 2002 – Newhall, California, of the following misdemeanor: 484 (A) PC – Theft. Defendant was sentenced to 30 days jail and 36 months probation.
5. The applicant was convicted January 15, 2008 – Newhall, California, of the following felony: 666 PC – Petty theft with prior jail. Defendant was sentenced to 2 years prison.
6. The applicant was convicted February 17, 2009 – Los Angeles, California, of the following misdemeanor: 853.7 PC – Failure to appear after written promise. Defendant received a suspended sentence.

7. The applicant was convicted March 8, 2011 – Newhall, California, of the following misdemeanor: 40508 (A) VC – Failure to appear: written promise. Defendant received jail sentence to fulfill.

ORDER


Applicant, Marquette DeShawn Jones is hereby granted a probationary Applicator's license. The license is placed on probation for five years on the following terms and conditions:

1. Compliance with all provisions of the Business and Professions Code, Division 3, Chapter 14, Structural Pest Control Operators, and California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Professional and Vocational Regulations, Division 19. Applicant shall obey all laws and rules relating to the practice of structural pest control.
2. Obey all Local, State and Federal laws.
3. Quarterly Reports. Applicant shall file quarterly reports with the Board during the period of probation.
4. Tolling of Probation. Should Applicant leave California to reside outside this state, Applicant must notify the Board in writing of the dates of departure and return. Periods of residency or practice outside the state shall not apply to reduction of the probationary period.
5. Notice to Employers. Applicant shall notify all present and prospective employers of the terms, conditions and restrictions imposed on Applicant by said Order. Within 30 days of the effective date of this Order, and within 15 days of Applicant undertaking new employment, Applicant shall cause his employer to report to the Board in writing acknowledging the employer has read the Order in this matter.
6. Completion of Probation. Upon successful completion of probation, Applicant's applicator license will become fully effective.
7. Violation of Probation. Should Applicant violate probation in any respect, the Board, after giving Applicant notice and an opportunity to be heard, may revoke the probationary license through an administrative hearing process.
8. Field Representative's License. Should Applicant apply for a field representative license and pass the examination, the Board shall issue a field representative license, which shall be immediately placed on probation for the same duration and under the same terms and conditions as set forth in this Order.

ACCEPTANCE

I have carefully read the Order. I understand the Order and the effect it will have on my applicator license. I enter into this Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to be bound by the Order of the Board.
