**STIPULATION FOR A  
PROBATIONARY LICENSE**

Jeremy Patrick Moffett, applicant for a structural pest control applicator license (hereinafter applicant or respondent), and William H. Douglas, Interim Executive Officer, Structural Pest Control Board (Board), hereby stipulate as follows:

1. This applicant is not presently licensed as a structural pest control applicator, field representative or an operator with the Board in the State of California.
2. On August 17, 2011, the applicant successfully passed the applicator license examination. Question number 11 on the application asked: "*Have you ever been convicted of a felony or of a misdemeanor other than minor traffic infractions?*" The applicant checked the box marked "yes" next to question number 11 and wrote "Pos. narcotics for sale, GTA, Pos. stolen property". The applicant signed the application, attesting that he had read and understood the complete application and declared that all of the information contained in his application was true and accurate.
3. The applicant was convicted May 25, 2006 – Lancaster, California, of the following felonies: 10851(A) VC – Take vehicle without owner's consent/Vehicle Theft. Defendant was sentenced to an 8 month prison sentence; 459 PC – Burglary. Defendant was sentenced to a two year prison sentence.
4. The applicant was convicted April 10, 2008 – Lancaster, California, of the following felony: 11378 HS – Possess control substance for sale. Defendant was sentenced to a two year prison sentence.

## ORDER

Applicant, Jeremy Patrick Moffett is hereby granted a probationary Applicator's license. The license is placed on five years probation on the following terms and conditions:


1. Compliance with all provisions of the Business and Professions Code, Division 3, Chapter 14, Structural Pest Control Operators, and California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Professional and Vocational Regulations, Division 19. Applicant shall obey all laws and rules relating to the practice of structural pest control.
2. Obey all Local, State and Federal laws.
3. Quarterly Reports. Applicant shall file quarterly reports with the Board during the period of probation.
4. Tolling of Probation. Should Applicant leave California to reside outside this state, Applicant must notify the Board in writing of the dates of departure and return. Periods of residency or practice outside the state shall not apply to reduction of the probationary period.
5. Notice to Employees. Applicant shall upon or before the effective date of this Order, post or circulate a notice to all employees involved in structural pest control operations which accurately recite the terms and conditions of probation. Applicant shall be responsible for said notice being immediately available to said employees. "Employees" as used in this provision includes all full-time, part-time, and temporary and relief employees and independent contractors employed or hired at any time during probation.
6. Completion of Probation. Upon successful completion of probation, Applicant's operator license will become fully effective.
7. Violation of Probation. Should Applicant violate probation in any respect, the Board, after giving Applicant notice and an opportunity to be heard, may revoke the probationary license through an administrative hearing process.

## ACCEPTANCE

I have carefully read the Order. I understand the Order and the effect it will have on my operator license. I enter into this Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to be bound by the Order of the Board.


