20	1. Susan Saylor (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity as
21	the Registrar/Executive Officer of the Structural Pest Control Board, Department of Consumer
22	Affairs.
23	2. On or about June 27, 2012, the Structural Pest Control Board issued Applicator
24	License Number RA 53334 in Branches 2 and 3 to Aaron D. Palmer (Respondent). The
25	Applicator License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein.
26	The Applicator License was suspended on November 24, 2012, for failure to comply with a
27	judgment or order for family support, pursuant to Family Code section 17520. The Applicator
28	License will expire on June 27, 2015, unless renewed.

1	JURISDICTION
2	3. This Accusation is brought before the Structural Pest Control Board (Board),
3	Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section
4	references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.
5	4. Section 8620 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may suspend or
6	revoke a license when it finds that the holder, while a licensee or applicant, has committed any
7	acts or omissions constituting cause for disciplinary action or in lieu of a suspension may assess a
8	civil penalty.
9	5. Section 8625 of the Code states:
10	The lapsing or suspension of a license or company registration by operation of
11	law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender of a license or company registration shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to
12	proceed with any investigation of or action or disciplinary proceeding against such licensee or company, or to render a decision suspending or revoking such license or registration.

14	STATUTORY PROVISIONS
15	6. Section 482 of the Code states:
16 17	Each board under the provisions of this code shall develop criteria to evaluate the rehabilitation of a person when:
18	(a) Considering the denial of a license by the board under Section 480; or
19	(b) Considering suspension or revocation of a license under Section 490.
20	Each board shall take into account all competent evidence of rehabilitation furnished by the applicant or licensee.
21	7. Section 490 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that a board may suspend or
22	revoke a license on the ground that the licensee has been convicted of a crime substantially
23	related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the business or profession for which the
24	license was issued.
25	8. Section 493 of the Code states:
26 27 28	Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in a proceeding conducted by a board within the department pursuant to law to deny an application for a license or to suspend or revoke a license or otherwise take disciplinary action against a person who holds a license, upon the ground that the applicant or the licensee has been convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of the

Conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a structural pest control operator, field representative, applicator, or registered company is a ground for disciplinary action. The certified record of conviction shall be conclusive evidence thereof.

Any individual who has been denied a license for any of the reasons specified in Section 8568, or who has had his or her license revoked, or whose license is under suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while it was under suspension, or who has been a member, officer, director, associate, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee of any partnership, corporation, firm, or association whose application for a company registration has been denied for any of the reasons specified in Section 8568, or whose company registration has been revoked as a result of disciplinary action, or whose company registration is under suspension, and while acting as such member, officer, director, associate, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee had knowledge of or participated in any of the prohibited acts for which the license or registration was denied, suspended or revoked, shall be prohibited from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee of a registered company, and the employment, election or association of such person by a registered company is a ground for disciplinary action.

11. Section 8655 of the Code states:

A plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere made to a charge substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a structural pest control operator, field representative, applicator, or registered company is deemed to be a conviction within the meaning of this article or Section 8568 of this chapter. The board may order the license or registration suspended or revoked, or may decline to issue a license, when the time for appeal has elapsed, or the judgment of conviction has been affirmed on appeal or when an order granting probation is made suspending the imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under the provisions of Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code allowing the individual or registered company to withdraw a plea of guilty and to enter a plea of not guilty, or setting aside the verdict of guilty, or dismissing the accusation, information or indictment.

2	12. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1937.1 states:
3	For the purposes of denial, suspension or revocation of a license or company
4	registration pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the code, a crime or act shall be considered to be substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a linearce or registered commence with the commence of the substantially related to the qualifications,
5	functions or duties of a licensee or registered company under Chapter 14 of Division 3 of the code if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of such licensee or registered company to perform the functions outborized by the
6 7	such licensee or registered company to perform the functions authorized by the license or company registration in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare. Such crimes or acts shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

1	COST RECOVERY
2	14. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the
3	administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of
4	the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and
5	enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being
6	renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be
7	included in a stipulated settlement.
8	CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
9	(June 24, 2014 Criminal Conviction for Petty Theft on April 30, 2014)
10	15. Respondent has subjected his license to disciplinary action under sections 490 and
11	8649 of the Code in that he was convicted of a crime that is substantially related to the
12	qualifications, functions, and duties of an applicator. The circumstances are as follows:
13	a. On or about June 24, 2014, in a criminal proceeding entitled <i>People of the</i>
14	State of California v. Aaron David Palmer, in Sonoma County Superior Court, case number SCR-
15	649667, Respondent was convicted on his plea of nolo contendere of violating Penal Code section
16	484(a), petty theft, a misdemeanor.
17	b. As a result of the conviction, Respondent was granted conditional
18	probation for 24 months, and sentenced to serve one day in jail, with pre-custody credit for one
19	day. Respondent was ordered to submit to a Fourth Amendment waiver, pay fees and fines, and
20	stay away from the Safeway store in Windsor.
21	c. The circumstances that led to the conviction are that on the evening of
22	April 30, 2014, loss prevention officers at a Windsor Safeway store observed Respondent conceal
23	a bottle of whiskey and a sandwich in his front pants pocket. Respondent was intercepted outside
24	of the store when he left without paying for the items. Respondent resisted being detained by the
25	loss prevention officers; he was handcuffed and taken to the security office. A Sonoma County
26	Sheriff's Deputy interviewed Respondent who admitted he was intoxicated and hungry when he
27	went into the store. Respondent was arrested and transported to jail.

1	OTHER MATTERS
2	16. Pursuant to section 8654 of the Code, if discipline is imposed on Applicator License
3	Number RA 53334 issued to Respondent, Aaron D. Palmer shall be prohibited from serving as an
4	officer, director, associate, partner, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee for
5	any registered company during the time the discipline is imposed, and any registered company
6	which employs, elects, or associates Aaron D. Palmer shall be subject to disciplinary action.
7	PRAYER
8	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
9	and that following the hearing, the Structural Pest Control Board issue a decision:
10	1. Revoking or suspending Applicator License Number RA 53334, issued to Aaron D.
11	Palmer;
12	2. Ordering Aaron D. Palmer to pay the Structural Pest Control Board the reasonable
13	costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions
14	Code section 125.3;
15	3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
