1	JURISDICTION	
2	3. This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following	
3	laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.	
4	STATUTORY PROVISIONS	
5	4. Section 490 states, in pertinent part:	
6	"(a) In addition to any other action that a board is permitted to take against a licensee, a	
7	board may suspend or revoke a license on the ground that the licensee has been convicted of a	
8	crime, if the crime is substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the business	
9	or profession for which the license was issued.	
10	"(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a board may exercise any authority to	
11	discipline a licensee for conviction of a crime that is independent of the authority granted under	
12	subdivision (a) only if the crime is substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties	
13	of the business or profession for which the licensee's license was issued.	
14	"(c) A conviction within the meaning of this section means a plea or verdict of guilty or a	
15	conviction following a plea of nolo contendere. Any action that a board is permitted to take	
16	following the establishment of a conviction may be taken when the time for appeal has elapsed, or	
17	the judgment of conviction has been affirmed on appeal, or when an order granting probation is	
18	made suspending the imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under the	
19	provisions of Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code."	
20	5. Section 8620 provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may suspend or revoke a	
21	license when it finds that the holder, while a licensee or applicant, has committed any acts or	
22	omissions constituting cause for disciplinary action or in lieu of a suspension may assess a civil	
23	penalty.	
24	6. Section 8625 states:	
25	"The lapsing or suspension of a license or company registration by operation of law or by	
26	order or decision of the board or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender of a license or	
27	company registration shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to proceed with any investigation

of or action or disciplinary proceeding against such licensee or company, or to render a decision suspending or revoking such license or registration."

7. Section 8649 states:

"Conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a structural pest control operator, field representative, applicator, or registered company is a ground for disciplinary action. The certified record of conviction shall be conclusive evidence thereof."

8. Section 8654 states:

8 "Any individual who has been denied a license for any of the reasons specified in Section 9 8568, or who has had his or her license revoked, or whose license is under suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while it was under suspension, or who has been a member, 10 officer, director, associate, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee of any 11 partnership, corporation, firm, or association whose application for a company registration has 12 13 been denied for any of the reasons specified in Section 8568, or whose company registration has 14 been revoked as a result of disciplinary action, or whose company registration is under suspension, and while acting as such member, officer, director, associate, qualifying manager, or 15 responsible managing employee had knowledge of or participated in any of the prohibited acts for 16 17 which the license or registration was denied, suspended or revoked, shall be prohibited from 18 serving as an officer, director, associate, partner, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee of a registered company, and the employment, election or association of such person by 19 2.0a registered company is a ground for disciplinary action."

9. Section 8655 states:

"A plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere made to a
charge substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a structural pest control
operator, field representative, applicator, or registered company is deemed to be a conviction
within the meaning of this article or Section 8568 of this chapter. The board may order the license
or registration suspended or revoked, or may decline to issue a license, when the time for appeal
has elapsed, or the judgment of conviction has been affirmed on appeal or when an order granting
probation is made suspending the imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under

the provisions of Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code allowing the individual or registered company 1 to withdraw a plea of guilty and to enter a plea of not guilty, or setting aside the verdict of guilty, 2 3 or dismissing the accusation, information or indictment." 4 **REGULATORY PROVISIONS** 10. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1937.1 states, in pertinent part: 5 "For the purposes of denial, suspension or revocation of a license or company registration 6 7 pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the code, a crime or act shall be considered to be substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a licensee or 8 9 registered company under Chapter 14 of Division 3 of the code if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of such licensee or registered company to perform the 10 functions authorized by the license or company registration in a manner consistent with the public 11 health, safety, or welfare." 12 13 COST RECOVERY 11. Section 125.3 states, in pertinent part, that a Board may request the administrative law 14 judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to 15 pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case. 16 17 FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE 18 (Conviction of Substantially Related Crime) 19 12. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under sections 8649 and 490, in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1937.1, in that Respondent has 20 been convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a 21 licensed applicator, as follows: 22 23 On or about June 18, 2014, after pleading nolo contendere, Respondent was convicted a. of one felony count of violating Penal code section 459 [second degree: commercial burglary] 24 and one felony count of Penal Code section 594 [vandalism] in the criminal proceeding entitled 25 The People of the State of California v. Frank Javier Negrete (Super. Ct. L.A. County, 2014, No. 26 KA106107). The Court sentenced Respondent to serve 360 days in Los Angeles County Jail and 27

28 placed him on 3 years probation, with terms and conditions.

b. The circumstances surrounding the conviction are that on or about June 2, 2014, a
manager for El Pollo Loco restaurant in Glendora, CA, unlocked the doors to the premises and
noticed the smell of something burning. She noticed the alarm was not set and the office lights
were on. Respondent suddenly opened the office door and ran out carrying a white bag. The
manager looked in the office and saw smoke. She noticed the safe had been cut. Police later
stopped Respondent's vehicle and conducted an investigation.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Conviction of Substantially Related Crime)

9 13. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under sections 8649 and 490, in
10 conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1937.1, in that Respondent has
11 been convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a
12 licensed applicator, as follows:

a. On or about August 12, 2011, after pleading nolo contendere, Respondent was
convicted of one misdemeanor count of violating Business and Professions Code section 25657,
subdivision (b) [permitting persons to solicit alcoholic beverages] in the criminal proceeding
entitled *The People of the State of California v. Francisco Javier Negrete* (Super. Ct. L.A.
County, 2011, No. 1RI03172). The Court placed Respondent on probation for two years with

18 || terms and conditions.

b. The circumstance surrounding the conviction are that on or about October 29, 2010
and February 11, 2011, Respondent unlawfully employed and knowingly permitted female
employees to solicit patrons to purchase alcoholic beverages for their own consumption. During
an investigation by the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control it was discovered that
Respondent purchased beer from local off-sale retail stores and permitted female employees to be
paid commission for each beer they solicited.

1	DISCIPLINE CONSIDERATIONS	
2	14. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent,	
3	Complainant alleges, as follows:	
4	a. On or about June 8, 2001, after pleading nolo contendere, Respondent was convicted	
5	of one misdemeanor count of violating Business and Professions Code section 23300 [selling	
6	liquor without a license] in the criminal proceeding entitled The People of the State of California	
7	v. Frank Javier Negrete (Super. Ct. L.A. County, 2001, No. 1RH02787). The Court placed	
8	Respondent on 2 years probation, with terms and conditions.	
9	OTHER MATTERS	
10	15. Section 8620 provides, in pertinent part, that a respondent may request that a civil	
11	penalty of not more than \$5,000 be assessed in lieu of an actual suspension of 1 to 19 days, or not	
12	more than \$10,000 for an actual suspension of 20 to 45 days. Such request must be made at the	
13	time of the hearing and must be noted in the proposed decision. The proposed decision shall not	
14	provide that a civil penalty shall be imposed in lieu of a suspension.	
15	16. Pursuant to section 8654, if discipline is imposed on Applicator 's License No. RA	
16	53877, issued to Respondent, Respondent shall be prohibited from serving as an officer, director,	
17	associate, partner, qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee for any registered	
18	company, and any registered company which employees, elects, or associates Respondent shall be	
19	subject to disciplinary action.
