ACCUSATION

15 **Applicator's License No. RA 56109**

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18 Complainant alleges:

19 **PARTIES**

20 1. Susan Saylor (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity as the
21 Registrar/Executive Officer of the Structural Pest Control Board (Board), Department of
22 Consumer Affairs.

23 2. On or about July 29, 2014, the Board issued Applicator's License Number RA 56109
24 to Salvador Cadenas (Respondent). The Applicator's License was in full force and effect at all
25 times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on June 30, 2018, unless renewed.

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1 **JURISDICTION**

2 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board, under the authority of the following
3 laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise
4 indicated.

5 4. Section 8620 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may suspend or
6 revoke a license when it finds that the holder, while a licensee or applicant, has committed any acts
7 or omissions constituting cause for disciplinary action or in lieu of a suspension may assess a civil
8 penalty.

9 5. Section 8625 of the Code states:

10 The lapsing or suspension of a license or company registration by operation of
11 law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, or the voluntary surrender
12 of a license or company registration shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to
13 proceed with any investigation of or action or disciplinary proceeding against such
licensee or company, or to render a decision suspending or revoking such license or
registration.

14 **STATUTORY PROVISIONS**

15 6. Section 482 of the Code states:

16 Each board under the provisions of this code shall develop criteria to evaluate
the rehabilitation of a person when:

17 (a) Considering the denial of a license by the board under Section 480; or

18 (b) Considering suspension or revocation of a license under Section 490.

19 Each board shall take into account all competent evidence of rehabilitation
20 furnished by the applicant or licensee.

21 7. Section 490 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that a board may suspend or
22 revoke a license on the ground that the licensee has been convicted of a crime substantially related
23 to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the business or profession for which the license was
24 issued.

25 8. Section 493 of the Code states:

26 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in a proceeding conducted by a board
27 within the department pursuant to law to deny an application for a license or to suspend
28 or revoke a license or otherwise take disciplinary action against a person who holds a
license, upon the ground that the applicant or the licensee has been convicted of a crime
substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of the licensee in question,
the record of conviction of the crime shall be conclusive evidence of the fact that the

1 conviction occurred, but only of that fact, and the board may inquire into the
2 circumstances surrounding the commission of the crime in order to fix the degree of
discipline or to determine if the conviction is substantially related to the qualifications,
functions, and duties of the licensee in question.

3 As used in this section, 'license' includes 'certificate,' 'permit,' 'authority,' and
4 'registration.'

5 9. Section 8649 of the Code states:

6 Conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and
7 duties of a structural pest control operator, field representative, applicator, or registered
company is a ground for disciplinary action. The certified record of conviction shall be
8 conclusive evidence thereof.

9 10. Section 8654 of the Code states:

10 Any individual who has been denied a license for any of the reasons specified in
11 Section 8568, or who has had his or her license revoked, or whose license is under
suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while it was under suspension, or
12 who has been a member, officer, director, associate, qualifying manager, or responsible
managing employee of any partnership, corporation, firm, or association whose
13 application for a company registration has been denied for any of the reasons specified in
Section 8568, or whose company registration has been revoked as a result of disciplinary
14 action, or whose company registration is under suspension, and while acting as such
member, officer, director, associate, qualifying manager, or responsible managing
15 employee had knowledge of or participated in any of the prohibited acts for which the
license or registration was denied, suspended or revoked, shall be prohibited from serving
16 as an officer, director, associate, partner, qualifying manager, or responsible managing
employee of a registered company, and the employment, election or association of such
17 person by a registered company is a ground for disciplinary action.

18 11. Section 8655 of the Code states:

19 A plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere made
20 to a charge substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a structural
pest control operator, field representative, applicator, or registered company is deemed to
21 be a conviction within the meaning of this article or Section 8568 of this chapter. The
board may order the license or registration suspended or revoked, or may decline to issue
22 a license, when the time for appeal has elapsed, or the judgment of conviction has been
affirmed on appeal or when an order granting probation is made suspending the
23 imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under the provisions of Section
1203.4 of the Penal Code allowing the individual or registered company to withdraw a
24 plea of guilty and to enter a plea of not guilty, or setting aside the verdict of guilty, or
dismissing the accusation, information or indictment.

25 REGULATORY PROVISIONS

26 12. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1937.1 states:

27 For the purposes of denial, suspension or revocation of a license or company
28 registration pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the code, a crime
or act shall be considered to be substantially related to the qualifications, functions or

1 duties of a licensee or registered company under Chapter 14 of Division 3 of the code if to
2 a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of such licensee or
3 registered company to perform the functions authorized by the license or company
4 registration in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare. Such crimes
5 or acts shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

6 (a) Any violation of the provisions of Chapter 14 of Division 3 of the code.

7 (b) Commission of any of the following in connection with the practice of
8 structural pest control:

9 (1) Fiscal dishonesty

10 (2) Fraud

11 (3) Theft

12 (4) Violations relating to the misuse of pesticides.

13 13. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1937.2 states:

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15 (b) When considering the suspension or revocation of a structural pest control
16 license or company registration on the grounds that the licensee or registered company
17 has been convicted of a crime, the board, in evaluating the rehabilitation of such person or
18 company and his or her or its present eligibility for a license or company registration will
19 consider the following:

20 (1) Nature and severity of the act(s) or offense(s).

21 (2) Total criminal record.

22 (3) The time that has elapsed since commission of the act(s) or offense(s).

23 (4) Whether the licensee or registered company has complied with any terms of
24 parole, probation, restitution or any other sanctions lawfully imposed against the licensee
25 or registered company.

26 (5) If applicable, evidence of expungement proceedings pursuant to Section 1203.4
27 of the Penal Code.

28 (6) Evidence, if any of rehabilitation submitted by the licensee or registered
company. . . .

COSTS

12. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the
administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of
the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and
enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being

1 renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be
2 included in a stipulated settlement.

3 **CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

4 **(June 2, 2015 Criminal Convictions for unlawful sexual intercourse with minors)**

5 13. Respondent has subjected his license to disciplinary action under sections 490 and
6 8649 of the Code in that he was convicted of crimes that are substantially related to the
7 qualifications, functions, and duties of a licensee. The circumstances are as follows:

8 a. On or about June 2, 2015, in a criminal proceeding entitled *People of the*
9 *State of California v. Salvador Cadenas*, in Orange County Superior Court, case number
10 14NF4041, Respondent was convicted on his plea of guilty of violating two counts of Penal Code
11 section 261.5, subdivision (c) (unlawful sexual intercourse), a felony, and Penal Code section 272,
12 subdivision (a)(1), contributing to delinquency of minors, a misdemeanor. Pursuant to the plea
13 agreement, the court dismissed an additional count of Penal Code section 245, subdivision (a)(4),
14 (assault of a person by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury).

15 b. As a result of the convictions, Respondent was granted formal probation for
16 (3) three years, be committed to the custody of the sheriff for 120 days with credit for one day
17 served, which can be served in the supervised electronic confinement (ankle bracelet), pay fees and
18 fines, and comply with the terms of probation.

19 c. The circumstances that led to the convictions are that on or about between
20 January 1, 2012 and April 20, 2014, Respondent willfully and unlawfully had sexual intercourse
21 with two minors, who were both under the age of 18 years old.

22 **DISCIPLINARY CONSIDERATION**

23 14. To determine the degree of discipline, on August 26, 2011, Respondent was
24 convicted in the Orange County Superior Court, in case number 11NM14196, on his plea of guilty
25 to violating Penal Code section 415(1), (disturbing the peace), a misdemeanor. Pursuant to the
26 plea agreement, count one and two were dismissed, violation of Penal Code section 240,
27 (attempting to commit a violent injury against another person), and Penal Code section 242,
28 (willfully and unlawfully intentionally using force upon another person). Respondent was granted

1 informal probation for three years and ordered to pay fees and fines.

2 a. The facts and circumstances that led to the conviction are that on June 29,
3 2011 around 8:30 p.m., Respondent got in an altercation with another person in the City of
4 Anaheim.

5 **PRAYER**

6 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
7 and that following the hearing, the Structural Pest Control Board issue a decision:

8 1. Revoking or suspending Applicator's License Number RA 56109, issued to Salvador
9 Cadenas;

10 2. Prohibiting Salvador Cadenas from serving as an officer, director, associate, partner,
11 qualifying manager, or responsible managing employee of any registered company during the
12 period that discipline is imposed on Applicator License Number RA 56109, issued to Salvador
13 Cadenas;

14 2. Ordering Salvador Cadenas to pay the Structural Pest Control Board the reasonable
15 costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code
16 section 125.3;

17 3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
