

ADVANCE NOTICE OF INTENT TO READOPT EMERGENCY REGULATIONS

This notice is sent in accordance with Government Code section 11346.1(a)(2) and California Code of Regulations title 1 (CCR), section 52, which requires State of California agencies to give five (5) working days advance notice of intent to re-adopt emergency regulations with the Office of Administrative Law (OAL). The Structural Pest Control Board (SPCB) intends to file a request for re-adoption of the Wood Destroying Organism (WDO) Emergency Fee Increase emergency regulations originally approved by OAL on August 22, 2019 and which became effective August 22, 2019.

Pursuant to CCR section 52(b)(1), the SPCB has made substantial progress and proceeded with diligence to comply with Government Code section 11346.1(e) by undertaking the following activity:

- The SPCB has prepared draft regulatory documents to make the emergency rulemaking permanent and has worked diligently with the Department of Consumer Affairs to obtain the required approvals of the rulemaking file prior to filing with OAL.

The SPCB seeks to re-adopt this emergency regulation to continue protecting the public. Through this re-adoption, the emergency regulation would continue to remain effective to ensure the SPCB can continue to fulfill its statutory obligations of consumer protection and protection of the public. There are no changes to the text from the prior emergency regulation.

As required by 1 CCR section 52, there has been no change in emergency circumstance since the original adoption of the WDO Emergency Fee Increase emergency regulation by OAL. The SPCB hereby incorporates by reference the rulemaking record of OAL file number 2019-0816-02(E) and notes that no changes have been made to the prior emergency text.

The SPCB plans to file the re-adoption of the WDO Emergency Fee Increase emergency regulation package with OAL at least five working days from the date of this notice. If you would like to make comments on the re-adoption of the WDO Emergency Fee Increase emergency regulation, they must be received by both the SPCB and OAL within five calendar days of the SPCB's filing at OAL.
